1. WHAT AREAS OF LEARNING DOES THIS ASSESSMENT ADDRESS?

Knowledge and understanding of:

- Industry Study - all areas
- Industry Related Manufacturing Technology including:
 - Multimedia elements and concepts
 - Types of media and mediums as well as their characteristics
 - Text
 - Image (bitmap) and Graphics (vector)
 - Audio
 - Video
 - Animation - 2D & 3D Animation, Keyframing
 - Web - CSS, HTML and Streaming

2. WHY IS THE COMPLETION OF THIS ASSESSMENT IMPORTANT?

This task will draw together an understanding of fundamental multimedia concepts, providing students with the opportunity to demonstrate their knowledge, understanding and skills. This will also allow students to gain feedback on areas of strength and areas on which to improve for the HSC.

The structure and questioning style presented in this task will mirror that of the HSC examination.

3. WHAT STEPS DO I TAKE TO COMPLETE THIS TASK?

Task Outline

Using syllabus outcomes and content as a guide, students will be examined on the key areas of learning listed above.

The examination is 1.5 hours in duration with 5 minutes reading time.

Total Marks = 40

Section I - 10 marks Multiple Choice

Section II - 15 marks Short Answer

Section III - 15 marks Extended Response

As this is an examination you will need to prepare for this task by:

- Creating your summary notes page covering each topic listed above (you could use mind maps, flow charts, dot point lists etc).
- Accessing past papers on Moodle.
- Regularly completing practice examination questions
- Seeking teacher assistance on unclear work
- Ensuring all set work is up to date
