Task Description

Students will complete a Moodle Skills Quiz in their Forensic Archaeology period on the 15th September (Tuesday, Week 9).

The skills quiz will take place in the technology centre. You need to have your Moodle log in and make sure you can access the year 9 Forensic Archaeology page.

- Entomology
- Forensic pathology
- Anthropology

Details of Submission

The task will be marked out of 55, it includes multiple choice questions and true or false question, students will have 45 mins to complete the task.

Students are expected to line up outside the technology centre for their Forensic Archaeology period on the 15th September (Tuesday, Week 9).

You need to have your Moodle log in and make sure you can access the year 9 Forensic Archaeology page prior to the day.

The answers will save automatically, students need to press submit when they finish the quiz.

Teacher Feedback and Student Self-Reflection

- The task will typically be returned to students within one week of the due date.
- At this time feedback including information on how to improve will be provided through Moodle.
- Students can clarify or seek further feedback by speaker with their teacher or the assessment marker.
- You will also receive feedback on your literacy performance based on the criteria in the school's literacy marking rubric. The marks achieved for literacy will account for between 10% – 20% of the maximum task value.

Upon return of the task, students will also be expected to complete a self-reflection. Students will complete a self-reflection form which guides them to review the areas they had trouble with and plan for future learning.
